

Information about current National Threat level and its impact locally

Statement from Assistant Chief Constable Kier Pritchard

"The thoughts of everyone at Wiltshire Police remain with those affected following the horrific events in Manchester on Monday evening.

You will be aware of the recent decision was taken by the Joint Terrorism Analysis Centre (JTAC) to raise the national threat level to "critical". This means that an attack remains highly likely but also that a further attack may be imminent.

As part of the response to this raise to critical Military personnel will be deployed to backfill police officers at key locations across the country.

There is no known specific threat to Wiltshire and the South West region at this time and it is unlikely that our communities will see a military presence on the streets.

The most important message is for the public to remain alert but not alarmed – police nationally and locally along with our partners, are doing everything we can to help protect the security of our citizens, public institutions, critical national infrastructure, and businesses and places.

Communities defeat terrorism, which is why we must maintain the strong relationship between the public and police. We depend on information from the public, who can be our eyes and ears, in our efforts to keep us all safe. Our security measures and activities are under constant review and we will keep communities updated.

Current local Policing Priorities

Ongoing Non-dwelling Burglary series (Continued)

Targeted patrols following recent series of overnight burglaries to sheds/ outbuildings and linked thefts of garden power tools. Recent offences –

12/05/17- SCHOOL ROAD, NOMANS LAND – attempt break in to garage, nothing believed to have been taken.

22/05/17 – SALISBURY ROAD, DOWNTON- building site entered fuel and boilers stolen 27/05/17 –THE SIDING, DOWNTON – attempt break in to two garages, no entry gained on either attempt.

Police Officers are carrying out stop/checks and searches of any suspicious vehicles and/ or persons, patrols to focus on areas close to county boundary.

Local officers are holding regular intelligence sharing meetings with colleagues from Hampshire and Dorset to co-ordinate our investigations.
